

Regulations for National Taiwan University Graduate Institute of Communication Engineering Scholarship Application

1. To support education, encourage students to provide services and assist students in research, Graduate Institute of Communication Engineering (GICE) offers scholarships to eligible graduate students.
2. There are two types of scholarships: non-service scholarship and service assistantship. The total number of scholarships and the amount to be awarded will be adjusted based on the funding GICE acquires for the year. Please follow the instruction to apply for either one.
 - Non-service Scholarships: The scholarships are offered to outstanding students, to encourage graduate search, and to provide financial assistance to students from low-income families.
 - Service Assistantships: Service assistantships provide financial support to graduate students who engage in teaching and perform administrative support.
3. Students enrolled in GICE are eligible to apply for the scholarships (students from China are excluded). The department will decide whether the candidate is eligible if he/she receives more than one scholarship. Teaching assistant and administrative assistant positions can only be filled by registered graduate students who do not work full-time off campus. Overseas Chinese students and international students who wish to work must obtain a working permit.
4. Service Assistantships include:
 - A Type: Teaching assistants are expected to assist with classes, lectures, labs, study groups and to provide support to other assigned responsibilities.
 - C Type: Administrative assistants are expected to coordinate GICE office activities and to perform administrative support functions.
5. Non-service Scholarships include:

- B Type: Available to GICE students only. The number of scholarships and the amount to be awarded will be determined by the GICE consultative committee.
 - D Type: Available only to graduate students studying for the master degree and ready to advance to doctoral candidacy in GICE. The number of scholarships and the amount to be awarded will be determined by the GICE consultative committee. If you have already received more than one competitive scholarship (such as Scholarships for Excellent Students of Communication Engineering) since fall 2015, please do not apply for the scholarship.
 - E Type: Available only to GICE students from low-income or lower-middle-income families and in the top 50% of the class last semester. The number of scholarships and the amount to be awarded will be determined by the GICE consultative committee.
6. Students offered an assistantship must work under the contract between the student and the department prior to the start date of the work. The agreement should stipulate the beginning and ending dates of the contract, place of work, working days, hours of work, employee's duties and responsibilities, stipends, regulations, termination of employment, and any other special conditions.
 7. If a student who receives more than one minor demerit for violation of university regulations within a year, he/she is not eligible for the scholarship and the award will be terminated. The scholarship received shall be returned as well.
 8. Any matter not provided for herein shall be in accordance with the Labor Standards Law and the provisions administered by the Ministry of Education.
 9. These regulations shall take effect upon approval of the GICE consultative committee. The same is true of any revision.
